

LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL PURPOSE

TO ORGANIZE, charter and supervise service clubs to be known as Lions clubs.

TO COORDINATE the activities and standardize the administration of Lions clubs.

TO CREATE and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world.

TO PROMOTE the principles of good government and good citizenship.

TO TAKE an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.

TO UNITE the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.

TO PROVIDE a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.

TO ENCOURAGE service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business, it is not necessary to tear down another's: to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.


WHENEVER a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or actions towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

ALWAYS bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give to them freely of my time, labour and means.

TO BE CAREFUL with my criticism and liberal with my praise. To build up and not destroy.



MELVIN JONES
FOUNDER
LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL

Melvin Jones was born on 13 January 1879 in Fort Thomas, Arizona, the son of a United States Army captain who commanded a troop of scouts. Later, his father was transferred and the family moved east.

As a young man, Melvin Jones made his home in Chicago, Illinois, became associated with an insurance firm and in 1913 formed his own agency.

Melvin Jones became a guiding principle for public-spirited people the world over. He died on 1 June 1961 at 82 years of age.

LIONS - LIBERTY, INTELLIGENCES, OUR NATIONS SAFETY LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL HISTORY



It all began as a dream of a Chicago businessman named Melvin Jones in the beginning of 20th century. Mr Jones had a great vision of local business clubs expanding their horizons from pure professional concerns to the betterment of not only their communities, but beyond.

He soon joined the Business Circle, a businessmen's luncheon group and was shortly elected secretary. This group was one of many at that time devoted solely to promoting the financial interests of their membership. Melvin Jones, however, had other plans. "What if these men," he asked, "who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities?" Thus, at his invitation, delegates from men's clubs met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organisation. An organisational meeting took place on 7 June 1917 in Chicago, Illinois, USA. "Association of Lions Clubs" then came into being.

A national convention was then held in Dallas, Texas, USA later in October of the same year. The constitution, by-laws, objects and code of ethics were established and approved during this meeting. Among the objects adopted in those forming years was one which read, "No club shall hold out the financial betterment of its members as its object". Such call for unselfish service to others remains one of the association's main tenets to date.

Melvin Jones eventually abandoned his insurance agency to devote himself full time to Lions and under his dynamic leadership; Lions Clubs earned the prestige necessary to attract civic-minded members.

One of his greatest honours was in 1945 when he represented Lions Clubs International as a consultant in San Francisco, California, at the organisation of the United Nations. Till today, Lions Clubs continues to hold consultative status with the United Nations.

In 1920, just three years after its formation, the association turned international when the first Canadian club was established. Major expansion, both nationally and internationally continued, particularly throughout Europe, Asia and Africa during the 1950's and 1960's.



HELEN KELLER

Helen Keller was born on 27 June 1880 in Tuscumbia, Alabama, USA. As a child, she developed a fever at 18 months of age, thereafter she became blind, deaf and mute.

At age 6, her teacher Anne Mansfield Sullivan taught Keller sign language & Braille. At age 10, Keller learned to speak. In 1898, Helen entered the Cambridge College and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree cum laude in 1904. In 1915, Keller joined the first Board of Directors of the Permanent blind Relief War Fund (later known as the American Braille Press). In 1924, the young woman started the Helen Keller **Endowment fund as well** as joining the staff of the American Foundation for the blind as a counselor on national and international relations.

Keller died on 1 June 1968 at age 87.

LIONS - LIBERTY, INTELLIGENCES, OUR NATIONS SAFETY LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL HISTORY



On 30 June 1925, Helen Keller addressed the Lions Clubs International Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio, USA. She challenged Lions to become "knights of the blind in this crusade against darkness". She said, "I am your opportunity. I am knocking at your door."

Her request to the Lions inspired Lions Clubs International to adopt the Sight Conservation and Work with the Blind Programme as a major service initiative.

In addition to sight programmes, Lions Clubs International is also committed to providing services for youth, improving the environment, building homes for the disabled, supporting diabetes education, conducting hearing programmes and providing disaster relief around the world through their foundation.

With the guiding principles enshrined in our Lions Purposes and Code of Ethics, Lionism has become a daily bread for over 1.3 million people throughout the whole world adding more life into their years and more years into their life.

Lionism calls for every Lion to bring out the best in him/her and promotes personal growth through "Service Above Self" based on 3 CORE VALUES. The core values are:

- 1) BE A BETTER PERSON
- 2) BUILD A BETTER COMMUNITY
- 3) BE A CITIZEN OF THE WORLD

1958

Formation of the Lions Movement in Singapore with the charter of the first Lions Club of Singapore (Host) on 5th November 1958.

1961

Setup of Provisional District 308 1st District Governor 1961-1962 - Late Minoo Warden (Host) 2nd District Governor 1962-1963 - Tan Kin Hong (East) 3rd District Governor 1963- 1966 - Late Eng Ah Koon (East)

1964

Provisional District 308 Second Convention was held at Victoria Memorial Hall, Singapore.

1967

The Provisional status of District 308 was dropped when it had more than 20 Lions Clubs chartered. The late Eng Ah Koon became its first District Governor FY 1967-1968.

1971

Singapore hosted its first OSEAL under the chairmanship of DG Peter YS Fu. 1,000 delegates attended.

1976

- Commencement of the Lioness Program in Singapore. It ceased to be an activity of the Lions Clubs in 1990.
- 1st Leo club Leo club of Central was formed on 7th August 1976. Sponsor club: LCS Central.

1980

Launch of an 18-bed nursing home by Founding Chairman Henry Kwek in Ang Mo Kio Ave 10.

1982

A resolution was adopted to re-district District 308 into 2 sub-Districts - 308-A and 308-B at the 1982 District Convention at Genting Highlands. District by then had grown to 81 Lions clubs with 2,598 Lions.

1983

Late DG Peter Y S Fu became the 1st Council Chairperson of MD308. Alec Chin (East) was elected 1st District Governor of D308-A and P S Ron (Kulim) D308-B's 1st District Governor.

1985

- Hosting of the 2nd OSEAL Forum with 4,500 delegates participation. PCC Peter Y S Fu was once again the Organising Chairperson.
- A 45-bed Lions Nursing Home was built at 41 Toa Payoh Rise.

1987

- LCI Convention approved the admission of female members as Lions. 9 out of 10 Lioness clubs converted to Lions clubs; Omega Leo clubs of mixed membership also converted into Lions Clubs.
- District 308-A gets its first lady Charter President – Lion Ying Wai Lin (Sentosa).

1988

District 308-A hosted the International Board of Directors Meeting in Singapore.

1991

MD 308 by then had grown to over 4,000 members in 144 clubs. Clubs from Singapore, Sabah, Sarawak, Southern Johore and Brunei made up MD 308-A.

1993

- Senior lions initiated a move to re-district Singapore from MD308 and be a single district. By now, Singapore has over 43 clubs.
- At the same time, PCC Shiva Banerjee was approached by the Ministry of Community Development to take over the befriending program.

1994

A referendum among the Lions of Singapore was conducted in November 1994 where it was resolved to remain in MD 308 as a sub-District on its own was adopted by a small margin.

1995

LBSA with the support of LCS North, Serangoon Gardens, Stamford, and several individual Lions, received the approval from ROS on 10th April 1995.

- MD308 once again re-districted into 4 subdistricts - 308A1 (Singapore)/ 308A2/308B1/308B2.
- Another Lions Home for the Elders (154 beds) at Bedok South was officially opened on 16th November 1997.



1999

- Then DG Han Thien Fong initiated successfully the adoption of LBSA as a District Program.
- Singapore hosted the 38th OSEAL Forum, the fifth to be convened in MD308. 6.700 Lions attended the event. Organising Chairperson was then the Late PCC Goh Sena Chee from 4th to 7th November 1999.

2000

Lions Quest Pilot Programme was launched by Ministry of Community Development in Singapore.

2001

On 26-8-2002, D308A1 together with LBSA and LHE celebrated the 36th National Day with a mega dinner for 3,000 seniors and children at the Singapore Expo Hall 4A. The late President Nathan was the GOH.

2002

A committee headed by PCC Shiva Banneriee was established to look into forming the Lions Welfare fund.

2003

- In January, Lions Home for the Elders was re-built from war bunkers to a modern building housing 200 residents and a 42-bed Dementia Ward.
- In April, D308-A1 registered itself as a society with ROS.

2005

LHE celebrated its 25 years of community service with a year-long celebration and festivity.

2006

The first District Charity Golf event was held with \$80.000 in proceeds donated to LHE. LBSA and Lions Foundation.

2007

Formalisation of the District Secretariat.

2008

Lions Clubs of Singapore celebrates 50 Years of Community Service with the publication of the 1st edition of Our Lions Story (commemorative book).

2009

The Haiti Earthquake Relief Fund - The Lions movement in Singapore under the encouragement of the District and LCI raised S\$27.996.19 for the earthquake victims of Haiti.

2010

- The Singapore Chingay Parade 2010 saw approx. 1000 Lions/volunteers participated under the Lions Flag on each nite of 19th and 20th February 2010. The audience worldwide heard the mighty roars of the Singapore Lions. The Lions Contingent was led by then DG Anthony Tay & 2nd International Vice President Dr Tam Wing Kun. They were accompanied by International Director Hih Ellis Surivati. Council Chairperson Simon Koh and IPDG Bobby Eng.
- A joint project The Sarawak Charity Ride 2010 - between Lions Clubs from District 308-A1 and A2 was held from 10th - 14th October 2010 in East Malaysia. This was a cycling event from Kuching to Miri.

2012

Lions visited Sri Lanka with donations and relief supplies for victims affected by Tsunami in the South and Civil War in the North. Another trip was done in May to build a shelter for needy children and destitute families.

2013

The 52nd OSEAL Forum was held in Singapore in November 2013. 6,650 delegates attended the event.

- The 52nd MD 308 Lions convention took place in Singapore in April 2014, Had 1,390 delegates participation.
- At this Lions convention. a resolution was proposed by the cabinet to form District Lions Training Institute (DLTI) to take charge of training needs of our District. The resolution was unanimously approved by the delegates.
- The 41st MD 308 LEO Forum was held in Singapore (May/ Jun 2014). 1,000 delegates attended.



2015

- District Mega Lunch was organised for 5,000 elderly at Changi Exhibition Centre to celebrate Singapore's Jubilee (SG50) and the Lions Centennial Year.
- A record of twelve 12 clubs were chartered under the governorship of then DG Leslie Yong (FY 2014/2015).

2016

District 308-A1 organised the first Lions Charity Show on 24th Jan 2016 in MediaCorp Studio, a live performance by local and overseas artistes telecast live on Channel 8. A total of S\$3.63 million (gross) was raised for Lions Home for the Elders and Lion Befrienders Service Association.

2017

- District 308-A1 Lions once again took part in Chingay Parade on 10th and 11th February 2017.
- To commemorate the Lions Clubs International Centennial Year, a fundraising Golf Tournament was held on 14th June 2017 at Seletar Golf & Country Club.

2018

Launch of the District e-Directory application.

2019

- A two-day carnival was held at Singapore Expo (16th - 17th Feb 2019) and a Gala Dinner (21st Feb 2019) at the Mandarin Orchard hotel were held to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Lions Clubs of Singapore.
- The Lions Clubs of Singapore 60th Commemorative Book (2nd Edition) was published.
- District organised the first YCE Program with youths from both China and Taiwan for 10 days of cultural immersion in Singapore.
- District's Joyous Mid-Autumn Festival Event on 8th September 2019 at the Macpherson Community Club Multi-Purpose Hall was awarded the Singapore Book of Records for the Most Number of Mooncakes (for 3000 recipients) made in One Location. More than 100 lions from 26 Lions Clubs participated in this Joint Clubs Project.

2020

- Around February 2020, the CoVid-19 Pandemic hit Singapore. District applied and received 2 grants:
- 1) The COVID-19 Emergency Grant of USD \$10,000/- (SGD\$13,763/-). The district used its own funds together with this grant for the Care Pack 55 Project (2000 care packs and 500 personal packs for nursing staff of Elderly Homes).
- 2) The LCIF District & Community Impact Grant of USD \$9,684.00 or SGD\$13,157.00 to supply 7500 face shields (Children) and 20,000 face masks to needy families in Bukit Batok East
- AT the 22nd D308-A1
 Convention held on
 13th April 2020, delegates voted with an overwhelming 61% to support a Resolution for Singapore District A1 to be a single independent district, relinquishing its MD's affiliation.

- Due the strict 2020-2021
 Circuit Breaker Lock Down
 measures, the 23rd Sub
 District Convention held on
 23rd to 25th April 2021 was
 a hybrid convention.
 Only 50 persons were
 allowed to attend the
 convention on 24th April 2021
 in person at the NUSS Suntec
 City Guild House. The rest of
 the delegates attended
 the convention via video
 conferencing using zoom.
- At the 59th MD 308
 Convention held on
 23rd May '21, the delegates
 voted in favour of the
 Resolution for District 308-A1
 Singapore to be a single
 independent district with a
 high 87% approval.
- The International Convention 2021 was conducted via remote means on 29th June 2021.



2022

- With the easing of the CoVid-19 lockdown measures, the 24th Sub District Convention held on 22nd to 24th April 2022 at Four Points by Sheraton, Jubilee Ballroom/ Coleman Room was held in person but with limited capacity to comply with safe distancing measures.
- Approval was obtained on the following resolutions:
- Sub District 308-A1 FORM a NEW DISTRICT and CEASE to be part of Multiple District 308
- 2) To amend the relevant Constitutions and By-laws in order to give effect to this Resolution so adopted
- 3) The assets of Multiple
 District 308 to be
 distributed to the new
 District be based on the
 number of members of Sub
 District 308-A1 in relation
 to the total membership of
 Multiple District 308 as at
 30th June 2023.

- The 60th MD 308 Convention was held in Singapore via Zoom on 22nd May 2022.
 1047 Lions registered as delegates from the 4 Sub District. The above-stated resolutions were approved accordingly.
- Visit by International President Brian Sheehan and Lady Lori from 1st to 3rd December 2022. They visited LBSA and LHE and were very impressed and proud of the achievements of Singapore Lions.

- The Lions 65 Community Carnival - a 2-day event was organised to celebrate 65 years of community service by Lions Clubs in Singapore. It was held at the multipurpose court opposite the Khatib MRT station.
- Year 2022-2023 saw a prolific growth in interest groups from a few to about 21 groups (with OC) to cater to the interests of fellow lions.
- D308-A1 Performance Team (Lions Karaoke and Dancing Interest Groups) won the MD308 Singer of the Lion King Contest at the Convention Banquet Dinner on 29th April 2023 at Sunway Pyramid Convention Centre, Selangor, Malaysia.
- The 61st Multiple District 308
 Lions Convention 2023 was
 the last the Multiple District
 308 Lions Convention
 Singapore Lions will attend
 as Sub District 308-A1. District
 308-A1 will re-district from
 Multiple District 308 and
 enters a new era on 1st July
 2023 as an Independent
 Single District known as
 District 309.

- On 11th July 2023, District Governor Yeo Siew Yam was endorsed by International President Dr Patti Hill as the first District Governor of the new Single District 309 (Singapore at the 105th Lions Clubs International Convention held in Boston, Massachusetts, USA.
- The Inauguration of the Lions Clubs of Singapore District 309 took place on 30th July 2023 at Hotel Shangri-La. Over 800 Lions and guests attended the function. The Guest of Honour was Mr Desmond Lee, Minister for National Development and Minister-in-Charge of Social Services Integration. Special Guests: Past International President Dr Tam Wing Koon BBS, MBE, JP (HK) / International Director Jeff Huang (China) / Past International Director Ellis Surivati (MD308) and several Members of Parliament.



- On 14th May 2023, an Ad-Hoc Committee was set up to work on the revision of Constitution and By-laws (CBL) of District 309. PDG Isabel Cheong headed the committee, and its committee members include DG Yeo Siew Yam, PCC Lim Hon Chee, DC Ying Wai Lin and GST Richard Khoo. Observers in this committee are PDG Anthony Tay, 1st Vice District Governor Shirley Lee and Cabinet Secretary Melvin Liu.
- The 60th OSEAL Forum was on held on 5th November 2023 in Manila, Philippines from 2nd 5th November 2023. A total of nineteen (19) Lions attended this Forum. The District Governor of District 309 was invited to represent the District in the meetings at the 60th OSEAL Forum.
- At the 2nd Cabinet Meeting on 11th November 2023 it was announced by DG Yeo Siew Yam that District will be organising the first D309 Lions Convention (scheduled on 28th April 2024) as there were no bidders from the Lions Clubs. The following Cabinet officers were duly appointed as:
- COC Chairperson GST Richard Khoo (LCS Bedok)
- Co-COC Chairperson Region 1 Chairperson Russell Kwan (LCS Marine Parade)
- Co-COC Chairperson Region 4 Chairperson Marilyn Low (LCS New Central)
- Co-COC Chairperson Region 6 Chairperson Jonathan Tan (LCS Katong)
- Advisor to COC -PDG Anthony Tay (LCS Marine Parade) / PDG Jeffrey Yang (LCS Vista)

- An EOGM took place on 22th February 2024 at LB AAC Clementi to seek for the approval for the use of SGD20,000 from the Convention Fund to subsidise \$50/- per delegate on the Convention Registration fee (SGD200/-) for the first four hundred participants. An approval of 83.3 % was obtained accordingly.
- To celebrate the significant milestone of 65 years in Lions service and mark the landmark establishment of the Lions Clubs International District 309, the District will publish a commemorative book D309, Our Lions Story. It is a historical narrative of the evolution of the Singapore Lions Movement over the past 65 years.
- The first D309 Lions
 Convention, a one-day affair,
 was held on 28th April 2024
 at the Orchid Country Club,
 The Grand Ballroom. A total
 of 400 delegates attended
 the event. At this convention
 (AGM), approval was obtained
 on the resolution to adopt
 the revised Constitution and
 By-Laws as the District 309
 Constitution and By-Laws.
- At the close of FY 2023-2024, the membership of District was approx. 3,700 with an increase of of 10 new clubs as at 9-6-24. Another 5 clubs are in the process of being chartered.

Every Lion knows who Melvin Jones is.

But, how many of us, Lions, in MD309 know who PID Noshir Pundole is?

How many of us know who introduced Lionism to us 65 years ago?

Yes, this man is none other than PID Noshir Pundole!

THE MAN WHO BROUGHT LIONISM TO SINGAPORE PID NOSHIR PUNDOLE

Noshir Pundole was born in March 1920 in India. He was a charter member of Lions Club of Bombay (now Mumbai Host).

Noshir's Lionistic journey began when he was invited by a British army officer by the name of William (Noshir could not remember his full name) to a Lions Club meeting sometime in 1951. He was so impressed with Lions Club's way of serving the community that after returning to Bombay, Noshir started looking into chartering the first Lions Club in Bombay. It took him several years to charter the Lions Club of Bombay, now Lions Club of Mumbai Host, but he finally managed to do so in 1956. Lion Noshir Pundole then became India's first District Governor in 1957 and again in 1958 and then International Director in 1964-1966.

PID Noshir's passion for Lionism did not stop at Bombay. He took Lionism with him to wherever he went on his business trips. He was in the travel agency business then and travelled to Singapore often where the manager of Air India was his good friend. His contacts for Lionism in Singapore were developed through this friend.

In 1957, PID Noshir had the opportunity to meet up with Behram R. Vakil, Prem P. Ohri and Naresh Rastogi. Needless to say, PID Noshir inspired them with Lionism. As a result, the four of them chartered the Lions Club of Singapore (now known as Lions Club of Singapore Host) on 5 November 1958. Three months later, Lions Club of Kuala Lumpur (now known as Lions Club of Kuala Lumpur Host) was chartered on 18 February 1959.

PID Noshir Pundole passed away in 2016 at the age of 96.

Lions Club of Singapore (Host) now has a total 15 twinned clubs, one of the highest in the world, and is actively in contact with all of them.

Over the years, Lions Club of Singapore (Host) is privileged and proud to have served and made significant contributions to the local community and beyond. Besides undertaking and supporting many fundraising and service projects for the Lions Home For The Elders, the Lions Befrienders Service Association and the Lions SaveSight Centre, the club also contributes regularly to the Lions Club International Foundation.

In recent years, the club organised Golf Challenges, Car-boot Sales and the annual Christmas Bake Sales, raising thousands towards the local Lions entities.

As Lions Club of Singapore (Host) enters its 65 years of charter with the Lions in Singapore serving in a new independent District, the members look forward to continuing its legacy and to be an exemplary club in District 309.

The Lions Club of Singapore East was chartered on 9 January 1961. We are the second oldest club in Singapore. Over the 63 years of our existence, the club has sponsored 16 Lions Clubs in Singapore and Malaysia, the Lioness Club, and the Leo Club of Temasek Junior College. We have also twinned with 12 Lions Clubs in the Asia Pacific Region, the most recent being the Lions Club of Pattaya. We continue to have good relations with our sister clubs and sponsored clubs.

Lions Club of Singapore (LCS) North was the fifth club to be chartered in Singapore. It was chartered on 8 October 1930 by Charter President, the late Kenneth A Middleton from Australia.

LCS North has a remarkable trail of innovative community service projects and activities in the early days such as members' wives organising Food and Funfair to raise funds for their Club Project fund and leading the Ladies' Committee to organise annual events for the next few years.

The most iconic project of the club is the Lions Befrienders Service Association (Singapore) founded by Ex-Past Council Chairman Shiva Banerjee, who played a principal role in strategy change to its operation by establishing and building the Lions Home For The Elders.

LCS North has always been a hub of Lions activities whether on its own or jointly with other Lions Club or non-Lions like-minded organisations. One of the notable examples is organising its own Lions Flag Day raising more than \$70,000.

LCS North is fortunate to be blessed with many outstanding leaders who took up leadership roles not only in the local district but also in the Multi-District 308 and Lions Clubs International. Its most outstanding leaders include our late Charter President Kenneth A Middleton, late Past President Dr Victor Fernandez, late Past President Chng Hwa Nam, Ex-Past Council Chairman Shiva Banerjee, Ex-Past President Chim Hou Yan and Past District Governor Gilbert Tan Peng Cheng.

LCS North has been serving Hot meals to more than 50 elderlies in Ghim Moh, Clementi and Holland Close since 1997.

Lions Club of Singapore Seletar was formed in 1983 by a group of service-minded golfers from Seletar Country Club and through the sponsorship of the Lions Club of Singapore Central. The main objective of the Club is to provide some assistance to the less privileged members of our society.

Today, the Club has 32 all-male members from all walks of life.



DISTRICT LIONS TRAINING INSTITUTE 309

The District Lions Training Institute (DLTI) was established by a resolution passed by delegates at the District Convention in 2014 to provide more effective training for Lions through coordinated training activities in the District. The DLTI is part of the organisational structure of District 309 and functions as the training arm of the District.

PCC Dr Winston Koh was initially appointed chairman for three years and was tasked with setting it up and ensuring its functioning. He was re-appointed Chairman for another three-year term from 2017 to 2019.

Lion Lawrence Sew is the 2020 - 2022 and 2022 - 2024 Chairman.

ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE (Admin):

A Committee headed by the DLTI Chairman is responsible for initiating and deciding on the district's training needs. The Administration Committee includes the members of the District Governor, First Vice District Governor, Second Vice District Governor, Global Leadership Team Coordinator, and DLTI Executive Committee.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (EXCO):

To execute the plan and decision made by the Administration committee.

It comprises:

- 1. Development sub-committee:
- a. The sub-committee is responsible for developing and updating all training materials to ensure consistency.
- b. Ensure facilitators receive ongoing training and access adequately maintained and archived training materials.

DLTI FUNCTIONS:

- Promote and provide continuity in the leadership development of Lions in the District.
- 2. Establish and maintain a group of District Facilitators to meet training needs.
- Conduct training at the District, Clubs and Cabinet levels.
- Attend to the needs, welfare and continuous development of Facilitators.
- 5. Advise the District in developing specific curricula and materials for various training programmes.
- Collate, archive, and keep records of training materials, which will form part of the DLTI library.
- Review training requirements to meet the overall training needs of the District.
- 8. Work closely with the District Global Action Team to achieve training objectives.

2. Planning & Operation sub-committee:

- a. Identify and plan training programmes to meet District, Lions & Facilitators' needs.
- b. Responsible for carrying out training plans, activities, and policies approved by the Administration and EXCO committees.
- c. Assign suitable facilitators for the training programmes.
- d. Maintain a record of the attendance of facilitators who participate in meetings and training sessions.

3. Publicity & Communication sub-committee:

- a. Create marketing materials to promote upcoming training programmes. Include a training synopsis that emphasises how it can benefit our Lions.
- b. Manage the DLTI website.

OTHERS:

- 1. We hold facilitator and committee meetings regularly.
- 2. Our team is constantly working on improving the training skills of our facilitators through continuous development and training programmes.
- 3. We aim to constantly improve and adapt to the changing needs of the Lions we serve.
- 4. Each year, we organise a strategic planning retreat to reflect on what we have done and the challenges that we faced. Identify areas for improvement and prepare for the following year.
- 5. We have established a Code of Conduct for District Facilitators and selection criteria for Lions who wish to attend training to become DLTI Facilitators.
- 6. We created a website to communicate with the Lions in the district.

SUMMARY:

The District Lions Training Institute provides training on various topics to meet the district's training needs. DLTI collaborates with the DG Team and the District GAT to achieve the district's training goals.

The DLTI team is responsible for creating and delivering training programmes for the district. They meticulously design the curriculum and select skilled facilitators from their team to carry out the training activities.

The ethos of DLTI is that every Lion is a potential Leader, with or without a title, office, or position. We aim to nurture and develop potential leaders to achieve their maximum potential.

LIONS BEFRIENDERS SERVICE ASSOCIATION (SINGAPORE)

Lions Befrienders (LB) is a voluntary welfare organisation formed in 1995 by the Lions Clubs of Singapore. A district programme of the Lions Clubs of Singapore District 309, LB has over 25 years of history in providing holistic care and support for seniors to age healthily in place with community participation, enabling them to enjoy purposeful and meaningful lives.

Through the active involvement of about 1,000 regular volunteers, LB engages close to 10,000 seniors via a spectrum of integrated eldercare services catering to their social, physical, cognitive, emotional and spiritual needs. LB currently operates 10 Active Ageing Centres, 2 Community Case Management Services regions (Queenstown & Clementi), 2 Senior Group Homes (Queenstown & Tampines), Home Personal Care (HPC) and enhanced Home Personal Care (HPC+) [Queenstown, Clementi & Tampines] services, as well as a Befriending arm reaching out to socially isolated seniors.



Charity Golf is a fundraising event where donors participate in a friendly golf tournament, supporting a greater cause to provide care for LB seniors.

LB Flag Day is conducted in different locations island-wide, with various Lions Clubs of Singapore playing a pivotal role in helping to receive contributions from members of the public.

PARTNERSHIPS WITH A CAUSE

LB has embarked on several fruitful partnerships in recent years. In 2023, LB joined hands with SUSS and 6 partners (AIC, FYCS, KWSH, NHG, NUHS and SingHealth) to gain insights into industry-leading approaches to capability-building in integrated care.

In 2022, LB signed a Memorandum of Understanding with five Biopharma-ceutical Manufacturers' Advisory Council (BMAC) companies, leveraging technology to detect mild cognitive impairment and dementia in seniors using an A.I.-based application.

OUTREACH

1) Enhanced active ageing services for all seniors

Since May 2022, all LB's 10 Senior Activity Centres (SACs) have been converted into Active Ageing Centres (AACs), providing an enhanced suite of services catering to all seniors. These include Active Ageing programmes, Befriending and Buddying, information and referral to Care services, Community Screening and a social connector for seniors.

2) Community Case Management Service (CCMS)

Lions Befrienders transited to Community Case Management Service (CCMS) from Cluster Support with effect from 1 April 2023. CCMS is an intensive case management programme specifically designed to help vulnerable seniors and their caregivers who face difficulties in managing their multiple health and social care needs to continue living in the community or age in place.

3) Home Personal Care (HPC) and enhanced Home Personal Care (HPC+)

Started in 2017, to strengthen support for frailer seniors and provide greater reassurance to family members, LB has been appointed by MOH to roll out HPC+ services at 3 (Queenstown, Clementi & Tampines) of the 11 pilot sites. The services include a 24/7 technology-enabled monitoring and response element to detect falls and incidents, so that family members can be assured that their loved ones will receive timely help when they need it.

4) Senior Group Home (SGH)

The Senior Group Home (SGH) programme is an assisted living model that enables frail seniors to co-reside independently in HDB rental flats retrofitted with elder-friendly features. Operating at Tampines and Mei Ling, SGH aims to provide comprehensive support to the seniors through services such as meals on wheels, medical escort transport and home nursing.

5) Community of Care (CoC)

Commissioned by AIC, CoC is an overarching framework that aims to build a local network of collaboration among community social and health partners, to provide holistic health and social care for residents in their neighbourhood. It aims to build a seamless care ecosystem for seniors so they could age well, in place, and within the community.

6) LB Tech Care Ecosystem

LB has been at the forefront of technology since its digitalisation plan was launched in June 2020. Deployed under LB's Community of Care (CoC) framework, innovations include "IM-OK" which empowers seniors to self-report their daily well-being, and "IM-Healthy" where seniors can conveniently measure their health status.

A non-profit organisation, Lions Home actively promotes and employs best practices in providing a comprehensive range of services and programmes for the ageing population.

Our first community home was founded in 1980 and it housed 18 destitute and elderly residents. Over the years, we have expanded our services, capabilities and capacities to include a holistic approach in elderly care and have grown to become one of Singapore's leading eldercare service providers in the community.

Today, Lions Home operates two fully equipped, well-designed nursing homes at Bishan and Bedok South, with the capacity to house 384 residents. We have a team of close to 240 professional clinical and care staff, as well as support services staff handling administration, finance, operations and social welfare functions. We also engage doctors and allied health professionals such as physiotherapists, occupational therapists and speech therapists, to complete our nursing home services.

KEY MILESTONES IN DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION

2019 - Smart Ward

In line with the nation's move towards being a Smart Nation, Lions Home For The Elders is poised to embrace the future of eldercare. Adopting a forward-looking and proactive approach in tapping on smart technology to provide a higher quality of care for our residents, the Smart Ward at Lions Home Bishan is a key milestone in our digitalisation journey.

Automated Turning Bed

- The automated turning bed allows the repositioning of residents to be automatically operated, reducing the time spent on turning the residents every two to three hours.

Thermal Scanner with Dashboard

- The thermal scanner with dashboard reduces the amount of time spent by staff in monitoring residents' temperature and allows them to perform other tasks.

Improvement of Hand Hygiene Compliance Using Wireless Monitoring

- The smartwatch device worn by staff automatically detects the staff performing the hand sanitising at the sanitising station and displays the number of times staff has sanitised their hands on the indicator on the same dashboard. The implementation of this device aims to improve hand hygiene compliance among staff.

2020 - OmiVista Mobii

OmiVista is a portable motion-activated projection system that is able to project interactive sensory activities, such as games and virtual colouring, on tables and floors and has various options to cater for different levels of dementia.

2022 - Kebbi Robot

A table-top social robot that can sing and dance with gestures, which has seen positive engagement among residents with dementia.

2023 - Dexie Robot

A life-size humanoid robot with realistic human-like facial features that is able to conduct activities such as singing, Bingo game and exercises for residents.

2023 - BIXEPS & Syrebo

Introduction of the BIXEPS machine which uses magnetic pulse therapy to strengthen muscles and the Syrebo robot gloves which utilises soft robotic exoskeleton technology for hand rehabilitation.

LIONS COMMUNITY SERVICE FOUNDATION SINGAPORE

During the governorship of District Governor Dr Winston Koh in FY1997/1998, the Long Range Planning Committee recommended the establishment of a Lions Foundation to be registered with the Registry of Societies and the Commissioner of Charities as an Institution of Public Character (IPC) with tax exemptions offered for donors. This was because its predecessor, the District Foundation which was set up to provide relief for natural disasters, was not able to solicit funds from the public as it was not a registered society.

At the 4th Sub-District 308-A1 Convention held in Singapore in April 2002, delegates unanimously approved by resolution the formation of the Lions Community Service Foundation (Singapore) [LCSF].

LCSF was registered with the Registry of Societies on 10 April 2003 and as a charity on 2 May 2003.

Lions Clubs, non-Lion VWOs, educational institutions of all levels as well as individuals in need of financial assistance may apply for grants from LCSF to support their projects or bursary fund in accordance with established guidelines for the application and disbursement of funds in furtherance of LCSF constitutional objectives. Grants from LCSF are received through its Grant Committee, approved by its Board of Directors, Trustees or members in general meetings depending on the amount of grant applied for.

Over the past 20 years, LCSF have touched countless lives.

VISION

To be recognised for achieving improvement in people's lives through community and humanitarian service from funds raised by Lions Clubs and Donors in Singapore.

MISSION

To support the efforts of Lions Clubs and Donors in Singapore in serving the community and addressing humanitarian needs through grants, programmes and partnerships.

OUR ACTIVITIES

Students:

The LCSF administered Singapore Lions Education Fund, established by the District in 2008 for the purpose of establishing scholarships, bursaries and other schemes to provide financial assistance to needy and deserving students from primary up to tertiary level.

Families:

LCSF also provides financial assistance to families made destitute due to the sudden death or illness of the main breadwinner or other economic hardship but whose family income does not meet the eligibility criteria for government financial assistance. Similar criteria also apply to grants to assist the procurement of prosthetic limbs through the Lions Prostheses Centre.

Lonely Elderly & Disadvantaged Youth:

During festive occasions, Lions Clubs organise festive treats for youth and elderly residents of welfare homes and lonely elderly participants at neighbourhood senior activity centres. LCSF funds such large scale festive treats organised at restaurants, as well as limited scale monthly or weekly social gatherings mainly over lunch at senior citizens activity centres or even at the void decks where these elderlies who live by themselves meet regularly to socialise.

FUTURE CHALLENGES

Just like any other charity, the main challenge that LCSF faces is in fund raising. LCSF does not get any funding or subvention from the government. Any assistance from the government is through its Enhanced Fund-Raising Programme of dollar-for-dollar matching grant for fund-raising projects that help the less fortunate in our community.

LCSF held its first fundraising event, "Evergreen Classics Charity Concert" by Ding Yi Music Company on 22 October 2022 at the School of the Arts (SOTA) concert hall. This year, LCSF in partnership with Mediacorp's Love 97.2FM, organised a Lunar New Year Charity Reunion Lunch on 28 January 2024. Apart from raising funds for LCSF's programmes, this event was an invaluable opportunity for LCSF to share about its activities to members of the public through radio.

CONCLUSION

LCSF will continue to look for areas where we can help as we continue our mission of helping those in need and making a meaningful difference in the lives of those we serve.

Lions SaveSight Centre (LSSC) Singapore was registered on 1 July 2008 with Registry of Societies as a Lions entity. The founding Chairman was the late Professor Arthur Lim, of SNEC (Singapore National Eye Centre). Last year, LSSC celebrated its 15th Anniversary with a Celebration Dinner on 29 September 2023 at the Chui Huay Lim Club.

LSSC is serving one of the 5 Lions Clubs International Global Causes, which is "Vision". The overall objective is to prevent avoidable blindness and to improve the quality of life for people who are visually impaired, especially the underprivileged and vulnerable in our community.





LSSC'S ACTIVITIES FOR THE PAST 15 YEARS INCLUDE:

- 1. Annual Eye Screening projects for the seniors in our community, "Lions World Sight Day" which is usually held in the month of October in conjunction with LCI World Service Day.
- 2. Regular local eye screening projects for the seniors at selected community centres, Homes and Active Ageing Centres (AAC's).
- 3. Regular Eye Care Lectures & Education Talks to the public and schools to educate our young on the importance of proper eye care.
- 4. We pivoted to regular Virtual Eye Webinars via Zoom which was started during the Covid-19 measures (2020 to April 2022) when mass physical health screening activities were not allowed.
- 5. Current mode of operation in 2023/2024 is now hybrid with a combination of regular online webinars as well as physical eye screenings.
- 6. LSSC has just started in 2024 eye screening projects for needy school students.

Todate, LSSC had screened the eyes of many thousands of senior beneficiaries in our community and educated many on eye conditions via its public education efforts.

The current chairman of LSSC is Ms Charity Wai. She is supported by the Board of Directors of LSSC. LSSC is supported by 65 Ordinary Voting Member Lions Clubs of Singapore.

LIONS PROSTHESES CENTRE (SINGAPORE)

Singapore has one of the world's highest number of diabetes-related amputations; over 1,500 cases a year or about four a day. The high costs of artificial limbs deprive some lower income amputees the joy of independence, forcing them to rely on crutches or wheelchairs for limited mobility.

Lions Prostheses Centre (Singapore) (LPC) was founded in 2020 by a group of 21 Lions Clubs in Singapore to offer a second chance for amputees from poor or underprivileged families to live full, independent, and productive lives.

This is a gift of hope and well-being not only to the amputees but also to their spouses, children and family members who are caregivers. LPC will also offer to service and repair existing prostheses which are made through our sponsorship.

LPC's Social Service Agency (SSA) was approved by the Singapore Registry of Societies on 12 May 2020 (UEN T20SS0073D). In January 2023, it was also approved as a Charity under the Charities Act 1994. Its membership stands at 58 Lions Clubs with 1,621 Lions members as of 11 Jan 2024.

CABINET APPOINTMENTS 2023 - 2024
